

Entrepreneurship:

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

In order to promote educational and academic exchanges, and to achieve a successful and sustainable collaboration, GLA University hereafter referred to as "GLA," and California State University, San Bernardino, hereafter referred to as "CSUSB," endorse this Memorandum of Understanding.

Subject to applicable law, regulations and university policies, both institutions will endeavor to encourage direct contact, educational and research cooperation among their constituents, including students, faculty members and staff, departments and research institutes, and will endeavor to cooperate in the fields of interest to both institutions. The parties contemplate the following forms of cooperation:

- 1. Study abroad programs for GLA students to study at CSUSB for full academic year, one or two academic terms, or short term;
- Study abroad programs for CSUSB students to study at GLA for full academic year, one or two academic terms, or short term;
- 3. Exchange of faculty members for research, lectures, and discussions;
- 4. Short term training program for GLA faculty.

Terms, conditions and arrangements (academic, logistics, financial) of joint activities will be identified and negotiated for each specific case, prior to the commencement of the associated activities.

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It is understood that the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding will commence on the day of signature, and will continue thereafter for five years. Subject to annual review, this Memorandum may be extended for an additional period of five years unless any university provides a six-month written notice to the other university to terminate it. Academic and administrative representatives from both institutions will discuss the terms of a renewal at least six months prior to the termination of the current Memorandum of Understanding.

This agreement can be modified upon mutual agreement between academic and administrative representatives of both institutions.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR ACADEMIC COOPERATION BETWEEN UNIVERSITY OF MALAYA, MALAYSIA AND GLA UNIVERSITY, MATHURA, INDIA

Whereas **UNIVERSITY OF MALAYA**, a university established under the laws of Malaysia and having an address at Lembah Pantai, 50603 Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia (hereinafter referred to as "**UM**")

and

GLA UNIVERSITY, a university established under the U.P. State Legislative Act of 2009 (UP Act 21 of 2010) and having an address at 17th Km. Stone, Mathura-Delhi Highway, NH-2, Post Chaumuhan, Mathura (UP) 281406 INDIA (hereinafter referred to as "**GLAU**") seeking to improve understanding between their respective academic institution and to establish mutually beneficial collaborations benefiting their students, have agreed to sign this Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as the "MoU") as a first step toward achieving these shared goals.

NOW THEREFORE PURSUANT THERETO, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. SCOPE AND FIELDS OF ACADEMIC COOPERATION

- (1) The Parties hereby agree to implement within the framework of the rules and regulations applicable in each of the institutions and subject to availability of funds and resources, the following programmes and activities, which may include, but are not limited to:
 - (a) student and/or academic and administrative staff exchanges:
 - (b) joint research activities;
 - (c) exchange of publications, reports and other academic materials and information; and
 - (d) sharing of other activities and programmes in areas of mutual interest, where such sharing shall result in benefit to both Parties.
- (2) It is agreed that the terms and conditions of any agreed programme and activity contemplated in this MoU shall be the subject matter of separate written agreements to be negotiated and agreed upon by both Parties and/or any third

parties, wherever applicable. PROVIDED ALWAYS the decision whether to initiate and/or implement any programme or activity shall be at the sole discretion of each Party.

(3) The Parties agree to designate, on behalf of each institution, a coordinator whose responsibility will be to supervise the execution of this MoU and to draw up programmes or activities to be implemented under this MoU, setting out specific provisions concerning the exchange programmes, budget requirements and details of funding. For this purpose, the coordinator for UM is the Director, Nanotechnology and Catalysis Research Centre and for GLA University is Prof. P. Pramanik, Department of Chemistry, GLA University, Mathura.

2. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

(1) The Parties acknowledge that in the absence of any specific agreement in writing to the contrary, each Party will be responsible for its own costs and expenses in establishing and conducting programmes and activities contemplated under this MoU, including without limitation its own costs and expenses in travel and accommodation.

3. **JOINT PROPERTY**

- (1) The Parties agree that any intellectual property rights arising from or in connection with any programme or activity under this MoU, through and by the joint and collaborative efforts of both Parties shall be jointly owned and subject to any other terms and conditions as may be agreed upon in writing.
- (2) Both Parties shall acknowledge one another in any form of writing, publication or presentation based on research derived from the cooperative efforts of both Parties under this MoU, unless otherwise mutually agreed upon in writing by the Parties.

4. CONFIDENTIALITY

(1) The Parties agree and undertake to keep confidential at all times any information or data that may be exchanged, acquired or shared in connection with any programme or activity conducted pursuant to this MoU save where the same is already in public domain.

5. DURATION AND TERMINATION

- (1) This MoU shall take effect on and from the date of execution of this MoU and shall continue to be effective for a period of five (5) years and may be extended for such further period as may be agreed by the Parties in writing.
- (2) Notwithstanding clause 5 (1) above, this MoU may be terminated by either Party giving written notice to the other at least six (6) months prior to the proposed date of termination.
- (3) Notwithstanding clause 5 (2) above, the provisions of this MoU or any other written agreement in respect of any on-going exchange programme or any other form of

cooperative activity under this MoU shall continue to apply until their completion unless both Parties mutually agree in writing to the earlier termination of the programme or cooperative activity.

6. NOTICE

(1) Every notice, request or any other communication required or permitted to be given pursuant to this MoU shall be in writing, in English and delivered personally or sent by registered or certified post via air mail or by courier or facsimile (which shall be acknowledged by the other Party) to the Parties at the address and facsimile number as stated below:

- (4) The Parties hereby agree that they are not bound exclusively by this MoU and shall be at liberty to enter into any separate agreements or arrangements with any third party without reference to the other Party.

AGREEMENT FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF CENTER FOR SKILL AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT ON INDUSTRIAL IOT and Manufacturing AT GLA University.

This Agreement for Establishing Center for Skill and Entrepreneurship Development for Industrial IoT and Manufacturing at **GLA University** ("**Agreement**") is made on Dated 20th August 2019 by and between

The GLA University, established under U.P. State Legislative Act of 2009 (UP Act 21 of 2010) and ranked among the top Universities of Uttar Pradesh and India and has been accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with 'A' Grade and 12B status from UGC and recognized by University Grants Commission (UGC) under section 12B of UGC Act of 1956, having its campus at NH-2, Mathura-Delhi Road P.O. Chaumuhan, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh281406. (Hereinafter referred to as "GLAU)"

And

2. Dysmech Competency Services Private Limited a company incorporated under the laws of India and having its office at 425 Pride Purple Square, Aundh Ravet Road, Wakad, Pune 411057, Maharashtra, India (hereunder referred to as "DCS"); (which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to mean and include its successors and assigns) of the second part.





12-B Status from UGC

DCS and GLAU shall hereinafter be collectively referred to as Parties and individually as Party.

WHEREAS:

- 1. GLA University has gained a distinct image as an outstanding educational colossal among technical institutions of U.P., due to its inclination towards innovative and skillbased education. The unique attribute of GLA University is that it instils in its students an 'attitude to excel' in whatever they do and that stimulates it to take steps on eminence and go beyond the curriculum to develop the overall skills of its students. To further support this initiative, GLAU has identified Industrial IoT and manufacturing as a key area and is establishing skill centers to push growth in vital sectors like IoT, Manufacturing and Electronics, and is setting up Center for Skill and Entrepreneurship Development for Industrial IoT and Manufacturing. GLA University has also decided to embark high-priority Skill Development initiative to ensure Development and up gradation of skills of the workforce in the State and address the consequent projected skill shortage that the State is expected to face due to industrialization. The sectors with largest demand over the years will be IoT & Manufacturing. Skill Development is a key focus area of GLA University. The emphasis is in developing skills in partnership with industry, thus making the skills development program more industry relevant, self-sustainable and creating employment opportunities for youth.
- 2. DCS is engaged in the business of skill development, project management and system integrator of Skill Development Centers with software applications, hardware, Trainers and providing associated value-added IT services. DCS with Technology Providers i.e., Dassault Systems, PTC, Master CAM and others to provide latest technology updates and current market trends and Knowledge Partners Center for Skill and Entrepreneurship Development for IoT & Manufacturing and others to assist in imparting domain knowledge to enable DCS to train students in line with latest Industry needs and make them more employable.

DCS has agreed to set-up skill development for Industrial IoT and Manufacturing at GLA University





GLA University & DCS have mutually discussed and agreed to enter into this Agreement as detailed hereinafter.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS

- 1.1 "Agreement" has the meaning as set out in the introductory paragraph and shall include all schedules and annexure to this Agreement.
- 1.2 "CSED" Center for Skill and Entrepreneurship Development means technical education and skill development program to be hosted in the Hosting Institution.
- 1.3 "GLA University" has the meaning as set out in the head of the Agreement.
- 1.4 "DCS" has the meaning as set out in the head of the Agreement.
- 1.5 "Confidential Information" means with respect to a Party, all proprietary information (including trade secrets) of the disclosing Party and/or of third parties in the possession of the disclosing Party, treated as confidential and/or proprietary by the disclosing Party.
- 1.6 "Dispute Resolution" has the meaning set out in Section 9.
- 1.7 "Execution Date" has the meaning set out in the head of the Agreement.
- 1.8 "Effective Date" has the meaning set out in Section 4
- 1.9 "Event of Force Majeure" means an event beyond the control of a Party, which prevents a Party from complying with any of its obligations under this Agreement, including but not limited to:
 - a. Act of God (such as, but not limited to, fires, explosions, earthquakes, drought, tidal waves and floods)
 - b. War, hostilities (whether war be declared or not), invasion, act of foreign enemies, mobilization, requisition, or embargo.

- c. Rebellion, revolution, insurrection, or military or usurped power, or civil war.
- d. Contamination by radioactivity from any nuclear fuel, or from any nuclear waste from the combustion of nuclear fuel, radio-active toxic explosive, or other hazardous properties of any explosive nuclear assembly or nuclear component of such assembly.
- e. Riot, commotion, strikes, go slows, lockouts or disorder; or acts or threats of terrorism.
- 1.10 "Hosting Institution" means the institute where the CSED will be setup:
- 1.11 "Parties" has the meaning as set out in the head of the Agreement.
- 1.12 "Project" has the meaning as set out in Section 3.
- 1.13 "Applicable Law" shall mean all the laws national and international, enacted or brought into force as the case may be, and enforced by the parties as the case may be, and the regulations and notifications made thereunder and judgments, decrees, injunctions, writs and orders of any court of record, as may be in force and effect.

2. INTERPRETATION

- a. In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires:
- b. Words denoting the singular number shall include the plural and vice versa.
- c. Heading and bold typeface is only for convenience and shall not affect the construction of this Agreement.
- d. References to the word "include" or "including" shall be construed without limitation.

- f. A reference to a Clause or schedule is, unless indicated to the contrary, a reference to a clause or schedule of this Agreement.
- g. Words denoting a person shall include an individual, corporation, company, partnership, trust or other entity.





- References to dates and times shall be construed to be references to Indian dates and time.
- References to the word "days" shall, unless otherwise indicated, mean calendar days.
- j. The Schedules to this Agreement shall form an integral part of this Agreement and shall be read along with this Agreement and
- k. In addition to terms defined in Clause 1.1, certain other capitalized terms are defined elsewhere in this Agreement and whenever such terms are used in this Agreement, they shall have their respective defined meanings, unless the context expressly or by necessary implication otherwise requires.

3. PROJECT SCOPE

- 3.1. To make qualitative improvements in technical education by setting up of CSED.
 - a. Infrastructure Development in Hosting Institute's by adopting the latest Technologies in IoT, Engineering Design, Manufacturing and Management to serve the needs of all the industrial units.
 - b. Skill upgradation of faculty and students by providing hands on experience on standard industrial practices.
 - c. Improve campus placements of students by preparing Industry ready and experience engineers by engaging Industrial partners, placement channels and HR initiatives.
 - d. Promote Research & Development, Innovation for existing Industries.
 - e. Center for Skill and Entrepreneurship Development to focus on skilling students in line with latest Industry needs and make them more employable.
 - f. Promote Industry-Academia interface to make improvements and sustainable technical Education System and in line with Industry requirements.
 - g. Create a pool of skilled work force to cater to current and future industrial landscape of the state.
 - h. Availability of trained workforce to attract industries to set up units in the State.
 - Incubation of applied research into commercially viable products or entrepreneurial initiatives.
 - j. Invite scholars with career guidance on manufacturing engineering fields.





Obligation of DCS

- a. It shall act as proposer, implementer, system integrator and project manager for the overall project.
- b. It shall set up the Center for Skill and Entrepreneurship Development by installing and system integrating the hardware, software, and courseware.
- c. Skilling & Training of faculty and students. Operations of Center for Skill and Entrepreneurship Development for the Period of 30 months from the date of commencement of the first batch of Student & thereafter handover the operational responsibilities to GLA University.
- d. Scope of Work under Program
 - Providing reference material.
 - Skilling of students on supplied products.
- e. It shall operationalize the project within 3 months from the effective date and on providing access of the ready site at the demarcated institutions/locations, whichever is later.
- f. It shall deploy its team post Agreement for counseling of students through seminars to make them aware of the program and will continue the process every year at the start of the secession for the term of the program.
- g. It shall deploy its personnel, team of 5 to 7 at each of the CSED from 9:00 hrs.to17:00hrs on all the days in a year except Sundays and National Holidays and any other holiday/s as may be notified by GLA University in this regard.
- h. It shall assure that the assistance from the GLA University is utilized in a proper way for the successful implementation of the project. It shall provide progress report on implementation of the project on quarterly basis.
- i. It shall be responsible to comply with all the Appropriate Laws including all labor welfare legislations as may be applicable in the State of U.P., in respect of its personnel deployed for imparting training at the CSED.
- j. Certification of Project implementation to students upon successful completion of program.





- k. DCS will have a placement cell and coordinate with college placement department and industries to facilitate the placement process.
- DCS will invite Industrial speakers and experts on regular intervals.
- m.DCS to collaborate CSED with nearby industries and ensure industrial project worth **Rs Twenty Lac** in the period of two years.
- n. DCS will provide ERP "online portal" for CSED activities where students, College Management and parents can collaborate for the term of two years.
- DCS will provide complete detailed interior drawing with specification to the hosting institute.

3.3. Obligation of GLA University

- a. GLA University will be the hosting Institution.
- b. GLA University will identify the space for the setup of the CSED s. The institute must agree to run the center for additional 30 months. The project can remain in operation for maximum period of 5 years.
- c. GLA University will demarcate the required area of 15000 to 20000 square feet fully developed, which is easily accessible for setting-up of the labs. Provide the necessary permission as per project specifications outlined in the proposal, including furnishing, electricity, water, plumbing, adequate security and internet for the labs.
- d. Enrolling Students for program and collecting fees for the same.
- e. In consideration of the above obligations agreed to be undertaken by DCS, GLA University shall ensure that the payment of total sum of 5,00,00,000.00(Rupees Five Crore Only) exclusive of applicable taxes, as per the work order No. GLAU/DeanAA/Recognition/20_1/2019 to DCS. GLA University has to ensure timely disbursement of the payment to DCS for arranging supplies and initiating the project.
- GLA University will provide decent boarding facility for DCS team and Industrial speakers for the duration of the program.





- g. GLA University should not hire any DCS employees directly or indirectly via any thirdparty agency for the period of 60 months of the effective date.
- h. GLA University will ensure complete arrangement of Seminars and Counseling Program, i.e.
 - I. Arranging students
 - II. Coordinating schedule for Timetable
 - III. Facilitate of counseling room for a period of one week.
 - IV. Stay, food and boarding facility for DCS team in campus for 30 months.
 - Will assign one coordinator per department during the program.

3.4. Duration of the CSED

DCS will run the operations for the Center for 30 months and post that the functioning ownership will be transferred to GLA University at no additional cost. Timeline for calculating the support for 30 months, shall start from the date of commencement of the first batch of Student.

4. PAYMENT TERMS

The amount of 5,00,00,000.00 (Rupees Five Crore Only) exclusive of applicable taxes to be paid to DCS by GLA University, pursuant to this Agreement GLA University as per the schedule attached in Annexure A. The date of amount transfer to DCS account will be the "Effective Date".

5. GOVERNANCE AND MONITORING MECHANISM

Board of Governance:

The parties will form a board of governance to oversee the implementation and operations of the CSED s. The board will comprise of the following:

- One representative from GLA University.
- One representative from DCS.
- Two representation form students.
- One representation from Industry.





Except as agreed and provided under this Agreement, neither of the Parties shall be liable to bear or pay any damages arising out of loss of income, loss of profit, special, incidental, indirect, punitive, exemplary or consequential, to any party including third parties, and all such damages are expressively disclaimed.

7. TERMINATION

7.1 Termination by the GLA University -

Without limiting any other rights or remedies, the GLA University may terminate this Agreement effective immediately by giving 60 days' notice to DCS if:

- a. DCS breaches a material provision of this Agreement where that breach is not capable of remedy.
- b. DCS breaches any provision of this Agreement and fails to remedy the breach within 14 days after receiving notice requiring it to do so: or
- c. This Agreement is valid for Five (5) years from the effective date.

7.2 Termination by the DCS

Without limiting any other rights or remedies DCS may have against the Customer arising out of or in connection with this Contract, DCS may terminate this Contract by giving at least 60days' notice to the GLA University if;

- a. GLA University breaches a material provision of this Contract where that breach is not capable of remedy.
- b. GLA University breaches any provision of this Contract and fails to remedy the breach within 14 days after receiving notice requiring it to do so.

7.3 Termination does not affect accrued rights

Termination of this Contract does not affect any accrued rights or remedies of a party.





8. JURISDICTION OF THE AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of India and the courts of Ambala, Haryana shall have the jurisdiction to entertain any dispute or suit arising out of or in relation to this Agreement.

9. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In the event there being any dispute arising out of these presents, the same shall be firstly settled amicably, if fails, each party herein shall appoint an arbitrator in furtherance the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996. The arbitrators may appoint an umpire in the event of disagreement. The laws of India shall govern the same. The place of arbitration shall be Delhi.

10. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement together with all Appendices, Exhibits, Schedules, Attachments and Addenda attached hereto constitute the entire Agreement between the parties and supersedes all previous agreements, promises, representations, understandings and negotiations, whether written or oral, between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.

A. Objectives

The goal of this Cooperation is to foster collaboration, provide opportunity for Cancer Research and disease – detection Technology on the basis of reciprocity, best efforts, mutual benefit, and frequent interactions. G. Tenure and Termination

- The travel and daily allowance expenses will be borne by the home university for their students as well as faculty members.

(1) Our Mission

It aims is to unlock the entrepreneurial potential in this region and turn innovative ideas into products. NGIEDC-GLAU seeks to train and mentor the Indian youth through capacity building measures. NGIEDC-GLAU aims to become, by 2025, a vibrant hub of entrepreneurial activity in the North Indian region, such that local entrepreneurs drawn from students, faculty, staff and other local communities are able to incubate, nurture and grow business ideas into full-fledged companies with a significant market presence.

NGIEDC-GLAU has been set up with a vision to catalyze and promote development of knowledge-based and innovation-driven enterprises and to promote employment opportunities amongst youth, especially students.

The key objectives of NGIEDC-GLAU include:

- 1. Mentoring start-ups that will create products and services is specific and relevant sectors
- 2. Promoting discussion forums
- 3. Spearheading capacity building, knowledge creation and dissemination of knowledge in the field of innovation and entrepreneurship

(2) Purpose and Alliance benefits.

The purpose of this MOU is to facilitate coordination between the Parties in matters of common interest as set forth in Sections (3) and (4) of this MOU.

(3) Scope

The Parties intend to combine efforts to achieve their common objectives of addressing areas under promoting Start-ups and Entrepreneurship through this alliance. To this end, the Parties expect to cooperate on initiatives within areas of common concern, and to work together on projects that reflect their shared values within the potential areas of cooperation described in Section (4) of this MOU.

(4) Areas of Cooperation

- 4.2 JSS STEP and NGIEDC-GLAU are mutually agreeing to enter into *Co-Incubation* by extending Infrastructure, manpower, mentors, programmes available at the disposal of both the Parties at mutually agreeable terms and conditions.
- 4.3 JSS STEP and NGIEDC-GLAU are mutually agreeing to enter into Joint Incubation by agreeing on jointly identified viable ventures which can be jointly incubated/ funded/ supported/ mentored. All processes and due diligence will be done as per the laid down procedures and norms of the respective Parties. In case of equity or other charges taken from the startups for incubation, JSS STEP and NGIEDC-GLAU will share the same on mutually agreed arrangement on case to case basis.

- 6.2 The Parties expect to collaborate in the development of outreach and educational materials for external audiences, regarding the MOU and related activities. The Parties should obtain each other's approval prior to the issuance of any publicity related to activities under this MOU.

Memorandum of Understanding

This **Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)** is entered into this 10th day of October, 2019 by and between **GLA University**, 17km Stone, NH-2, Mathura-Delhi Road P.O. Chaumuhan, Mathura-281 406, Uttar Pradesh, India. Hereinafter called as GLAU and/or the first party

And

United Overseas Patent Firm having its office at 52, Sukhdev Vihar, New Delhi – 110025 hereinafter referred as UOPF and/or the Second party

WHEREAS, GLAU, the first party, is a higher educational institute that was established in the year 1991 and was declared as a "Deemed to be University" under Section 3 of UGC Act 1956 in the year 2010.

WHEREAS, UOPF is a law firm dedicated towards protection and enforcement of Intellectual Property Rights, of which Mr. Sudarshan Kumar Bansal, Advocate and Registered Patent Agent is the proprietor.

WHEREAS, GLAU and UOPF have mutually agreed to execute this Memorandum of Understanding towards *inter alia* facilitating the incorporation of the IPR Cell in GLAU, imparting training on IPR laws to the faculty, administration, members and students of GLAU and towards the filings, prosecution, registrations, renewals, oppositions, revocations, cancellations, infringements, claims, appeals of IPR matters of GLAU and performance of any matters ancillary with or incidental thereto.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration herein mentioned the parties accept the terms and conditions as mutually agreed and convey their acceptance.

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I. DEFINITIONS OF TERMS

- 1. In this Empanelment (as hereinafter defined) the following words and expressions shall have meanings hereby assigned to them, except where the context requires otherwise:
- 2. The "GLAU" shall GLA University with its premises located in Mathura, India.
- 3. The "UOPF" shall mean United Overseas Patent Firm, the second party, whose Bid has been accepted by the GLAU and includes the Firm/Agency's legal representatives, his/her successors and permitted assignees.
- 4. The "WORK" shall mean and include all works to be executed, all items and things to be provided/ done and services and activities to be performed by the UOPF in accordance with the terms of this Memorandum of Understanding.

 Intellectual Property Rights related services is annexed herewith as Annexure A.
- 2. The payment shall be remitted by the GLAU within a period of 30 (Thirty) days from the date of receipt of the invoice by the GLAU.
- 3. The service of invoice shall be made by the UOPF electronically through email, in addition to serving hard copy by courier/post to the GLAU. Provided that the service of invoice shall be deemed to completed upon receipt of the invoice by the GLAU through either electronic or physical delivery, or both.

IV. DURATION OF THE MOU:

The MOU shall be valid for a period of 05 (Five) Years from the date of its execution, which is extendable for a period as per mutual agreed. However, the MOU shall not exceed10 (Ten) years on the same terms and conditions, including costs, from the date of commencement of work, the fee would be appraised and reviewed every one year by the designated authority of the GLAU.

V. TERMINATION:

Either Party may request in writing a revision, modification or amendment of all or any part of this MoU. Any revision, modification or amendment agreed to by the parties shall be reflected in writing and shall form part of this MoU. Such revision, modification or amendment shall come into force on such date as may be determined by parties.

9. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

The MoU is not intended to create any legal obligations between the Parties. Any difference or dispute between the Parties concerning the interpretation and/or implementation and/or applicable to any of the provisions of this MoU shall be settled amicably through mutual consultation and / or negotiation between the Parties, without reference to any third party or international tribunal.

In case any disputes arise in implementing the MoU, these shall be resolved by mutual consultation.

10. EFFECTIVE DATE, DURATION AND TERMINATION

The MoU shall commence from the Effective Date and shall continue for a period of 3 years from the Effective Date (hereafter referred to as "Term"). Thereafter, both parties shall review the status of this co-operation and may extend the Term on such conditions as mutually agreed upon.

Notwithstanding the 10 paragraph 1 above, either party may terminate this MoU by notifying the other Party in writing at least Six (6) months in advance of such termination.

10.1 Unless otherwise agreed upon by the Parties, the termination of this MoU shall not affect the implementation of the on-going activities and/or programmes, which have been agreed upon before the date of the termination of the MoU.

13.2 The affected party to be able to avail of this clause will be obliged to inform the other party of:

- (a) The occurrence of any such event of force majeure; and
- (b) Resume its responsibilities on the cessation of such force majeure event.



 research under the supervision of research scientists from IoP-AS. The research outcomes performed
 at IoP-AS will be included as his/her progress report and Ph.D. thesis at IAH-GLAU.
- Upon approval on the qualifications of the recommended candidates, the IoP-AS provides research
 assistantship support and exposure in international meetings to these students at the same
 footing as local students during their stay at AS in Taiwan. Research output are shared by both
 parties.

- 4. The Ph.D. examinations are conducted according to the current Ph.D. ordinance of IAH-GLAU.
- Upon successful completion of the degree requirements, IAH-GLAU issues the official Ph.D. degree while IoP-AS issues certificates in recognition that the research has been conducted at the IoP-AS.
- The program includes mutual visits of the IoP-AS and IAH-GLAU scientists. These will include activities such as lectures, seminars, presentations as well as visits to laboratories and other scientific facilities.
- When new co-operation agreements would be made, this MoU will be amended and revised accordingly.

The parties, having discussed fields of common research interests and allied activities between the two institutions, have decided to enter into long-term collaboration for promotion of interinstitutional research, staff and students' training and postgraduate research in cutting edge areas in accordance with the provisions contained in the Guidelines issued vide Letter No. 2-8/2012- HRD dated 11 the December 2012 or as revised from time to time.

WHEREAS the "First Party" I CAR - Central Institute of Subtropical Horticulture (CISH)

AND WHEREAS the "Second Party", established vide Act No 21 of 2010 of Govt. of Uttar Pradesh and recognized (under section 2F) by UGC vide its letter number- F.No. 8-20/2010(ccp-1/PU Dated November 2010 at its Department of Biotechnology is involved in high quality of research in niche areas like biotechnology, microbiology, immunology, virology and molecular biology.

AND WHEREAS it has been considered expedient to agree in writing to participate jointly in the projects requiring expertise and logistics from both the parties.

Article 1. Scope

- 1.1 The objective of MoU is promotion of inter-institutional research collaboration, staff and students' training and postgraduate research in cutting edge areas by facilitating scientists, staff and students to seek specialized guidance and facilities of both the Institutes.
- 1.2 The Second party will recognize the First party as an Institute for conducting research related to the thesis requirement of the research students for Master's (MSc Biotechnology and M.Sc Microbiology & Immunology) and Doctorate (PhD) The Second party will recognize Scientists of the ICAR Institute as recommended by its Director in accordance with the University rules and regulations for guiding students working for the said degree.
- 1.3 Operational details of research effort and collaboration will be made in common research programmes and/or projects restricted to specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines/divisions. The objective(s) for research work for a student coming from a Second party outside NARS should be exclusively different as far as possible.
- 1.4 Research instrumentation facility and library facilities available with the First party and the Second party will be made available to the faculty and research scholars. However, the costs of specific consumables will be borne by the respective organizations.
- 1.5 There shall be an exchange of staff and students for academic, research and training purposes. Accommodation in the Hostel shall be arranged, wherever possible, as per extant rates. The duration of exchange visits will be determined by mutual consent between both the parties.

Article 2. Management

- 2.1 Director of the First party and the Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party will be responsible to work out operational details of cooperation between the two organizations and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MoU. An advisory committee may be constituted for this purpose with the members from both the parties.
- 2.2 The Advisory Committee will meet at least once in a year alternatively in the institutions of the First party and the Second party to review the activities. This meeting shall include presentation on the academic and research activities, which should be open to the students, faculty and scientists.

Article 3. Exchange of Information

3.1. The term "information" includes scientific or technical data, results and/or methods of investigation, and other information intended to be provided, exchanged, or arising under project descriptions entered into pursuant to this MoU.

3.2. The parties support the widest possible dissemination of information. Each party in joint projects shall be given the right to use, disclose, publish or disseminate such information for any and all purposes with mutual consent.

Article 4. General Provisions

- 4.1 It is understood that the First party and the Second party subscribe to the principle of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age, caste or religion. Both the Institutions shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither party shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students, which violate principles of non-discrimination.
- 4.2 Both parties understand that all financial agreements will have to be negotiated separately and will depend on the availability of funds.
- 4.3 Both parties acknowledge that exchange of staff and students from one party to the other shall be subject to the availability of funds and shall comply with the regulations and policies of the First party and the Second party.
- 4.4 Any research publications arising will be jointly published in accordance with the provisions laid out in Item 3.2.1C of the Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programme as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified vide Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December 2012 or revised guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time.
- 4.5 The student would invariably be the senior author for the publications arising out of the research work conducted at the AU/DU/Institutes, followed by Major Guide/Advisor and Co-Major Advisor/Co-Guide in that order. The names of corresponding author/additional co-authors, depending upon their contribution in the research work, may be decided by mutual consent between the student and Major Guide/Advisor.
- 4.6 The partnering institutions may ensure that the student submits at least one paper from Master's thesis and two papers from Ph.D. thesis before thesis submission in order to prevent students leaving the institute(s) without any research publication from the thesis.
- 4.7 A copy of the thesis/dissertation will be submitted to the First Party after the award of the degree by the Second party.
- 4.8 All questions related to this MoU arising during its term will be settled by the parties by mutual agreement. Disagreements at the operating level shall be forwarded to respective higher officials for appropriate resolution failing which an arbitrator of mutual acceptance may be identified for the settlement of dispute, if any.
- 4.9 All questions not foreseen related to this MoU will be handled by the parties by mutual agreement.

- 4.10 Nothing in this MoU is intended to affect other cooperation or collaborations between the parties.
- 4.11 The ICAR scientists pursuing their PhD degrees after completing their PhD course work at ICAR-DUs may be allowed to do their research work at the institute where they are posted, in view of shortage of scientists/faculty.
- 4.12 The objective(s) for research work for a student coming from such an institution should be exclusively different as far as possible.
- 4.13 RAs/SRFs, who have completed their course work and are working under different research projects in an Institute may be permitted to join a degree programme only with a University recognized by UGC/ICAR-AU system with bilateral MOU on IPR issues. However, PI of the project with the approval of Director may have to issue a certificate that the regular research work of the project will not be hampered on account of joining of RA/SRF for the degree programme. The RA/SRF will not avail leave for completing the research work for the degree.
- 4.14 The partnering institute(s) would be expected to make reasonable contribution in the form of intellectual input to the student's research problem and may not merely serve as a source of providing samples/facilities for the study.
- 4.15 The efforts will be made for conservation of animal cultures (bacteria, viruses or fungi) isolated in the study by deposition to the National Centre for Veterinary Type Cultures.

Article 5. Intellectual Property Rights

5.1 The Second party will be expected to ensure protection of the Intellectual Property Rights generated or likely to be generated during the student's research work. The ICAR as the first applicant (for its institute) and the Second party shall be the joint applicants for IPRs and the students and involved scientific staff shall be included as the inventor/breeder/author. The 'ICAR Guidelines for Intellectual Property Management and Technology Transfer/Commercialization' as amended from time to time shall be the reference for exploitation of the generated intellectual property, whose management and benefits sharing shall be mutually decided in each case.

The IPRs shall rest with the institution where the major part of the research work was carried out by the student. In the event of equal amount of work being carried out at both the AU/DU and ICAR Institute, patents/protections/knowledge generated will be shared in proportion as per the 'ICAR Guidelines for Intellectual Property Management and Technology Transfer/Commercialization' as amended from time to time.

Article 6. Admission and Fees

6.1 All those who wish to register as trainees or for Master/Doctoral programme under this MoU must apply for admission at the Second party.

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The allocation of Major Guide/Advisor would be finalized before the registration and will be governed by the provision laid outline item 3.2.1A and 3.2.2A of the guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified vide letter no.2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December 2012 or revised guidelines if any as may be issued from time to time for the students from within NARS and outside NARS respectively.

- 6.2 Admission of the students and the award of degrees for different programmes will be the responsibility of the Second party as per the rules and regulations.
- 6.3 Allotment of the students at the First party will be done by the approval of Director of the First party and Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party.
- 6.4 The First party would have the right to screen the student's eligibility for admission based on their academic period.
- 6.5 The HRD Cell of the First party in consultation with the representative of the Second party shall decide the location and sharing quantum of research work.
- 6.6 The number of student(s) at any particular time will be subjected to the availability of research facilities and scientists' time to guide thesis research at the First party institution.
- 6.7 Any student(s) admitted to the First party for training/postgraduate research, if found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the First party or indulge in such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of the Institute, or cause damage to the property, the registration of such student(s) would be summarily terminated. The Second party will not complete the formalities of issuing the certificates to such students until they compensate the losses to the First party.
- 6.8 Fee will be charged from the students by the first party as guidelines for the students to conduct research for the degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institution as notified vide letter no.2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December 2012 or revised guidelines if any as may be issued from time to time. No fee will be charged by the first party from the students registered with AU/DU within NARS. However students registered with second party outside NARS will deposit fee Rs 10,000 for training duration 3 months(not leading to a degree and dissertation) and Rs. 30,000 per semester(six monts) for training dissertation/degree exceeding three months. This Memorandum of Understanding (herein after referred to as MoU)is made on thisday of the month of December in the year 2019

BY AND BETWEEN

Millennium India Education Foundation having its head office at 13 Community Centre, East of Kailash New Delhi 110065 [herein after called MIEF], is a not-for-profit organization head quartered in Delhi, India. MIEF works towards the promotion, encouragement and conduction of research in the fields of Health, education, Science & technology and Community development (environment, art & culture) on the ONE PART

AND

The GLA University Mathura having its head quarters at Mathura [here in after called Second party] on the OTHER PART (who for the purpose of this MoU are herein after collectively referred to as the parties).

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The parties, having discussed fields of common research interests and allied activities between the two institutions, have decided to enter into long-term collaboration for promotion of interinstitutional research, staff and students' training and postgraduate research in cutting edge are as.

WHEREAS the "First Party" established as Trust under Indian Trust Act 1881 on 23rd June 2003 at Delhi is working to:

- i. Help people take up measures aimed at prevention of diseases of public health significance, communicable from animals to human and vice versa through "One health" concept. The platform offers help to exchange knowledge gained by researchers, practitioners of animal, human, agriculture and environmental sciences and thus proves helpful to devise a common mechanism aimed at maintaining a healthy ecosystem in the society.
- ii. Connect young generation to the scripts and languages like Sharada script, kashmiri language, so that the ancient scripts of great relevance can be deciphered. And
- iii. Help people understand and popularize science aimed at creating a healthy biodiversity in the neighborhood and help reduce climate change-related effects on all life forms.

AND WHERE AS the "Second Party", established vide Act No 21 of 2010 of Govt. of Uttar Pradesh and recognized (under section 2F) by UGC vide its letter number- F. No. 8-20/2010(ccp-1/PU Dated November 2010 at its Department of Biotechnology is involved in high quality of research in niche areas like biotechnology, microbiology, immunology, virology and molecular biology.

AND WHEREAS it has been considered expedient to agree in writing to participate jointly in the projects requiring expertise and logistics from both the parties.

NOW THIS MOU WITNESSTH AS HEREUNDER:

Article1.Scope

- 1.1The objective of MoU is promotion of inter-organsational research collaboration, staff and students' training and postgraduate research in cutting edge are as by facilitating students , scientists, staff and students to seek specialized guidance and facilities of both the organizations.
- 1.2 **The Second party** will recognize the First party as an organization for conducting research related to the thesis requirement of the research students for Master's (MSc, MVSc) and Doctorate (PhD). **The Second party** will recognize MIEF organization as recommended by its Director in accordance with the University rules and regulations for guiding students working for the said degree.
- 1.3 Operational details of research for and collaboration will be made in common research programmes and/or projects restricted to specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines/divisions. The objective(s) for research work for a student coming from a Second party should be exclusively different as far as possible.

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- 1.4 Research , instrumentation facility and library facilities as may be necessary for the researchers will be made available/facilitated by the First party and the Second party. However, the costs of specific consumables will be borne by the researcher/2nd party.
- 1.5 There shall be an **exchange of academic research** for training purposes if required. Lodging and boarding facilities shall be arranged, wherever possible, as per requirements .The duration of such exchange visits will be determined by mutual consent between both the parties.

Article2. Management

- 2.1 **Director/Head of the organization** of the **First party** and the Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the **Second party** will be responsible toward operational details of co-operation between the two and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MoU. An advisory committee may be constituted for this purpose with the members from both the parties.
- 2.2 The Advisory Committee will meet at least once in a year alternatively in the institutions of the First party and the Second party to review the activities. This meeting shall include presentation on the academic and research activities, which should be open to the students, faculty and scientists.

Article3. Exchange of Information

- 3.1. The term "information" includes scientific or technical data, results and/or methods of investigation, and other information intended to be provided, exchanged, or arising under project descriptions entered in to pursuant to this MoU.
- 3.2. **The parties support** the widest possible dissemination of information. Each party in joint projects shall be given the right to use, disclose, publish or disseminate such information for any and all purposes with mutual consent.

Article 4. General Provisions

- 4.1 It is understood that the **First party and the Second party** subscribe to the principle of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age, caste or religion. Both the parties shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither party shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students, which violate principles of non-discrimination.
- 4.2 **Both parties** understand that all financial agreements will have to be negotiated separately and will depend on the availability of funds.
- 4.3 **Both parties** acknowledge that exchange of staff and students from one party to the other shall be subject to the availability of funds and shall comply with the regulations and policies of the First party and the Second party.
- 4.4 Any research publications arising will be jointly published.

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- 4.5 The student would invariably be the senior author for the publications arising out of the research work conducted at either party's premises followed by Major Guide/Advisor and Co-Major Advisor/Co-Guide in that order. The names of corresponding author/additional co-authors, depending upon their contribution in the research work, may be decided by mutual consent between the student and Major Guide/Advisor.
- 4.6 The partnering institutions may ensure that the student submits at least one paper from Master's thesis and two papers from Ph.D. thesis before thesis submission in order to prevent students leaving the institute(s) without any research publication from the thesis.
- 4.7 A copy of the thesis/dissertation will be submitted to the First Party after the award of the degree by the Second party.
- 4.8 **All questions related** to **this MoU** arising **during its term** will be settled by the parties by mutual agreement. **Disagreements** at the operating level shall be forwarded to respective higher officials for appropriate resolution failing which an arbitrator of mutual acceptance may be identified for the settlement of dispute, if any.
- 4.9 **All questions** not foreseen related to this **MoU** will be handled by the parties by mutual agreement.
- 4.10 **Nothing i**n this MoU is intended to affect to the cooperation or collaborations between the parties.
- 4.11 The objective(s) for research work for a student coming from such an institution should be exclusively different as far as possible.
- 4.12 **Both parties** would be expected to make reasonable contribution in the form of intellectual input to the student's research problem and may not merely serve as a source of providing samples/facilities for the study.

Article 5.Intellectual Property Rights

5.1 The **Second party** will be expected to ensure protection of the Intellectual Property Rights generated or likely to be generated during the student's research work. **The MIEF** as the first applicant and the Second party shall be the joint applicants for **IPRs** and the students and involved scientific staff shall be included as the inventor/breeder/author. **The IPRs shall rest with both the parties.**

Article 6. Admission and Fees

- 6.1 **All those who wish** to register as trainees or for Master/Doctoral programme under this MoU must apply for admission at the **Second party**. The allocation of Major Guide/Advisor would be finalized after the registration by the 2nd party.
- 6.2 Admission of the students and the award of degrees for different programmes will be the responsibility of the Second party as per the rules and regulations.

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- 6.3 Allotment of the students to the First party will be done by the approval of Director/Head of the organization of the First party and Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party.
- 6.4 **The First party** would have the right to screen the student's eligibility for admission based on their academic period.
- 6.5 **The First party** in consultation with the **Second party** shall decide the location and sharing of quantum of research work to be done.
- 6.6 The number of student(s) at any particular time to be trained at the First Party facility will be mutually decided by both the parties from time to time.
- 6.7 Any student(s) admitted to the First party for training/post graduate research, if found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the First party or indulge in such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of the Institute, or caused image to the property, the registration of such student(s) would be summarily terminated. The Second party will not complete the formalities of issuing the certificates to such students until they compensate the losses to the First party.
- 6.8 Fee will be charged from the students by the first party to conduct research at places identified by the First Party and which has been accepted by the second party or revised guidelines if any as may be issued from time to time. Student registered with second party will deposit fee of Rs 20,000 for training duration of 3 months (not leading to a degree and dissertation) and Rs. 40,000 for duration of six months for training dissertation/degree exceeding three months or as may be mutually decided by both the parties.

Article7. Entry in to effect, modification and termination

- 7.1. This MoU shall be come effective on the date it is signed by the parties and shall be valid for five years extendable upto another five years. Both parties shall review the status of the MoU at the end of every two year period to determine any modification, whenever necessary. The period of validity of this MoU may be extended by mutual consent up to five years. This MoU may be amended by mutual written agreement and may be terminated at anytime by either party upon written notification signed by the competent authority of the party initiating termination. Such notification must be given to the other party at least six months in advance from the effective date of termination.
- 7.2. **All joint activities** not completed at the expiration or termination of the MoU may be continued until their completion under the terms of this MoU.
- 7.3 **No amendment or modification of the MoU shall be valid** unless the same is made in writing by both the parties or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be amendment of the MoU. The modifications/changes shall become part of the MoU and shall be effective from the date on which they are made/executed, unless otherwise agreed o.

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Memorandum of Understanding

- b. GLA-U hereby agrees to provide the following financial, material and labor resources in respect of the Project:
 - GLA-U shall have the right to receive payment from its end clients (students) or bear it themselves as part of the annual fee received from the students for the course
 - GLA-U shall be liable to pay Qversity as per the payment terms mentioned in Annexure 2

Communication Strategy

Marketing of the vision and any media or other public relations contact should always be consistent with the aims of the Project and only undertaken with the express agreement of both parties. Where it does not breach any confidentiality protocols, a spirit of open and transparent communication should be adhered to. Coordinated communications should be made with external organizations to elicit their support and further the aims of the Project.

Liability

No liability will arise or be assumed between the Partners as a result of this Memorandum.

Dispute Resolution

In the event of a dispute between the Partners in the negotiation of the final binding contract relating to this Project, a dispute resolution group will convene consisting of the Chief Executives of each of the Partners together with one other person independent of the Partners appointed by the Chief Executives. The dispute resolution group may receive for consideration any information it thinks fit concerning the dispute. The Partners agree that a decision of the dispute resolution group will be final. In the event the dispute resolution group is unable to make a compromise and reach a final decision, it is understood that neither party is obligated to enter into any binding contract to complete the Project.

No. 2-8/2012/HRD dated 11/12/2012):

This MOU hereinafter University refers to **GLA University**, **Mathura**, (established vide F.No. 8-20/2010 (cpp-1/PU dated 16 November, 2010) Government of Uttar Pradesh vide Act No. 21 of 2010 and Recognized by University Grant Commission) and Institute refers to Central Institute for Research on Goats (CIRG) and scope of the MOU will be Masters, Doctoral and Training programme.

- Article 10. Both parties shall review the status of the agreement at the end of each five year period to determine any modification whenever necessary. The period of validity of this agreement may be extended by mutual consent.
- Article 11. Either party may modify/ terminate this agreement with written notification signed by competent authority of the party initiating termination. Such notification must be given at least six months in advance of the effective date of termination.

F.no. 2-8/2012/HRD dated 01/12/2012): Student will deposit fee of Rs. 20,000/- for training and research up to duration of 3 months and Rs. 30000/- per semester (Six months) for training, research, and dissertation. Any change in fee structure by ICAR/CIRG will be applicable and should be followed by the Institute.


