Report on Gender Equity Program Date: 28/01/2017

Gender sensitization programs and activities should not be offered as an elective at the university level. It should be compulsory activities. People continue to believe that such courses may or may not be included in the program. They also believe that it will have little impact on a larger scale. However, this event will put to light the issues that both men and women confront at home and at work after growing up in a culture where women are mistreated and treated as second-class citizens. Women feel submissive to males because they are unaware of their own value. The sense of entitlement that the society has embedded in the minds of men, force them into believing in their superiority. These notions should be dealt with immediately for both men and women to balance their lives and gift a better quality of life for their children be it a boy or a girl.

Rather than just criticizing and forcing our females to remain at home, we should teach our men to be respectful and courteous of others. Gender equality does not ensure instantaneous outcomes. Although the procedure is lengthy, we have control over its consistency. We must guarantee that young students are exposed to the prospect of a society free of the epistemic disparities that result from gender inequality.

Considering all of these factors into account, the English department at the higher education level provides a regular course called "Introduction to Gender and Women Studies." The course's curriculum is enclosed herewith.

A Gender Equity Program for students of UG/PG was organized by the department of English from 28.01.2017 to 30.01.2017 at Block VI Ground floor IBM conference hall. Thirty three students participated in this program. Prof. Nitin Bhatnagar, Head of the Department welcomed chief guest, Prof. Anoop Kumar Gupta, Director, Dean of Academic affairs and other participants. After lighting of the lamp and SaraswatiVandana, Prof. Nitin Bhatnagar gave an

inaugural speech and informed to the participants about the need of gender awareness initiatives in universities and colleges.

Chief Guest, Prof. Anoop Kumar Gupta, Director, Dean of Academic Affairs also appreciated this course and program and shared his knowledge about government's National Youth Policy 2014. This policy identifies five well-defined objectives and 11 priority areas, and suggests policy interventions in each. He said that this policy priorities certain areas as education, skill development and employment, entrepreneurship, health and healthy lifestyle, sports, promotion of social values, community engagement, participation in politics and governance, youth engagement, inclusion and social justice. As government has undertaken initiatives to enable youth to fully participate in the job market and gain access to employment services similarly we should also come forward and contribute to strengthen our youth. Following that, a group discussion on "Gender Studies as a Compulsory Course in Higher Education" also took place. Candidates also presented a 5-minute poster presentation on same topic.

The keynote speaker was Ms. Shreya Debb, Advocate, High Court of Maharashtra. The programme was conducted with help of ILSR Faculty Members and active participation of ILSR's students. The aim of the programme was to raise the level of awareness about the importance of gender equality in education in order to alleviate the gender discrimination entrenched in the society. The following legal and social messages were convened to the students.

One of the grave concernsremains the continuing lesser enrollment of girl students at all levels of education. To inculcate awareness in the society to achieve gender balance in the realm of education remains a quintessential task that needs to be performed by every members of the society. Furthermore, it was discussed that how the dwindling number of girl students in the education sector decreases the productivity of the society. There were important conclusions, which were drawn, especially in the primary schools. That even the absence of basic amenities like washrooms discourage the girls from coming to the schools. Furthermore, the phenomenon of child labor, which remains rampant in the society, has also discouraged the parents from enrolling their wards in the schools. Report on Gender Equity Program Date: 15.02.2020

Generally speaking, now we have made substantive progress on gender parity in educational statistics, both in terms of access and school performance. However, serious obstacles to the full realization of the human right to the education of girls and women go far beyond school access or the treatment they receive in schools.

Among the main barriers are child labor (especially domestic work), early marriage and armed conflicts – which affect girls and women in particular – poverty, the influence of religions on educational policy decisions, violent and dangerous school environments and, especially, discriminatory practices that are repeated in schools, reflecting ideological and cultural constructions in our societies, which violate a set of human rights, especially the right to a dignified life, free from violence and discrimination.

Beyond the educational field, there are other strong injustices against women: their reduced political representation and unequal salaries they receive, their almost exclusive responsibility for domestic work and the care of family.

All these elements reveal that gender equality is still far from being fully accomplished, and the change in this scenario depends on a cultural transformation and the change of ingrained thoughts, what we understand will only become possible from reflection and a critical look on reality, elements that can and should be promoted in education and through it.

Considering all these subjects, the department of English organized a Gender Equity Program on

"The Right to Education with Gender Equality" on 15.02.2020 at Block VI Ground floor IBM

conference hall. Twenty seven students participated in this program. Prof. Panchanan Mohanty,

Head of the Department welcomed the chief guest Prof. Anoop Kumar Gupta, Director, Dean of

Academic Affairs and other participants. After lighting of the lamp and Saraswati Vandana,

Head of the Organizing Committee Prof. Nitin Bhatnagar gave an inaugural speech and

discussed about 'The Right to Education with Gender Equality' and said, "Women are entitled to

equal treatment. They are entitled to an excellent education. Everyone requires same education.

Regardless of whether you are a girl or a boy, rights remain the same. Women also have the

ability to influence the world, express their thoughts, and share their feelings about many issues".

Professor Anoop Kumar Gupta, Director IAH, from Department of English addressed the


